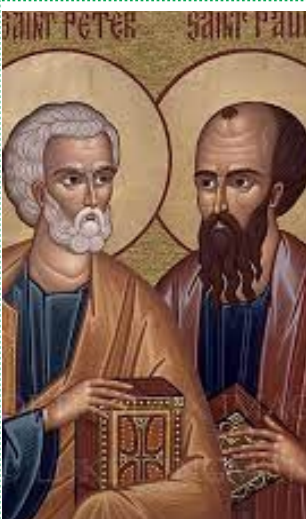
1ST THANKSGIVING MASS

THE FAMILY CONNECTION

There are many ways in which we can compare the request for healing made by Jairus and the request of the woman with the hemorrhage. One comparison helps us think about prayer. Jairus asked Jesus for healing on his daughter's behalf; the woman with the hemorrhage had no one to speak for her and bravely approached Jesus on her own initiative.

In our prayers, we do both. We intercede for others' needs, and we also courageously express our own needs to God. We find hope in Jesus' response to both of these people, who sought him out in their hour of need. As you gather as a family, talk about some of the things you have prayed for this week.

Notice that some of your prayers may have been for other people, and some of your prayers may have been for your own needs.

In today's Gospel we find encouragement for both kinds of prayer. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 5:21-43. Talk about the similarities and differences between the two people who presented their needs to Jesus in this Gospel. Notice that both people received the healing they sought from Jesus. We want to pray for the needs of others and for our own needs with as much faith and hope as Jairus and the woman with the hemorrhage did. Pray together in thanks and praise to God, who hears our needs and answers them, by praying today's psalm, Psalm 30.

AMENDED GUIDELINES FOR BURIAL MASS AND WEDDINGS IN CHRIST THE KING CHURCH

FUNERALS

1. Requiem Mass will be strictly one and half hour duration.
2. Total duration of tributes read in church should not exceed 20 minutes (total number of tributes read to be discussed with officiating priest).
3. Seating will be 3:2
4. Maximum seats in chapel 300. Option of hiring Parish hall for live streaming if additional capacity desired.
5. Main Chapel doors will be cordoned off when the seating capacity of 300 is reached.
6. Death Certificate to be authenticated by medical authority
7. Food packs to be distributed on exiting the chapel/hall after requiem Mass.
8. Filing past should be done under supervision of ushers maintaining strict social distancing.
9. Coffin together with any wreaths to be cordoned off.
10. Family to submit list of invitees to office staff.

WEDDINGS

1. Group photographs with officiating priests to be taken in church after wedding ceremony.
2. Group photographs with family and friends to be taken outdoors after wedding ceremony.
3. Mandatory wearing of face masks on church premises by all except the bride and groom.
4. Food packs to be distributed on exiting the chapel/hall after wedding.
