



## **FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

Dear parishioners,

#### Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice!

The third Sunday of Advent is Gaudete Sunday - a day of rejoicing. The three readings, in their own ways, invite us to rejoice. In the second reading, Paul tells the Philippians to rejoice in the Lord ALWAYS! And the reason is that The Lord is near! For us, too, the coming of the Lord at Christmas is getting close. In about two weeks, we will celebrate the mystery of the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Therefore, we have a reason to rejoice in the Lord.

Surrounded by many worries, aches and pains, uncertainty and anxieties, sometimes we forget that we are called to be joyful! Regardless of these dark moments, Paul reminds us that joy is an essential part of the Christian life. Lest we think that what Paul is saying is undoable, let us remind ourselves that Paul wrote to the Philippians from prison. Yes, from prison. He was going through a trying period of his life with death knocking on his door, yet he writes, Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! Paul had a good excuse to worry, but he did not. Instead, he explains to us the secret of victory over worry.

Christian joy has its source in the continual presence of Christ. There is enough in Jesus to furnish us with joy in the worst circumstance on earth. Because Christian joy depends on the presence of Christ, Paul says Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Prayer holds the key to helping us deal with our anxieties since prayer is the offering up of our desires to God. In prayer, we do not only lay bare our hearts to God, but also we ask Him to take our sorrows and fears to Himself. When we pray, we take anxieties to God and allow Him to refashion them.

When you put your prayers before God and hand over to Him the issues that rob you of joy, the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. In other words, the key to the peace that brings rejoicing lies in a calm disposition that springs from prayer. Advent season is a time for us to give more of our time to prayer. As you pray, ask God to fill your heart with His peace and strength to enable you rejoice always.


