

# FEAST OF THE **EPIPHANY YEAR C**

First Reading: The prophet foretells establishment of the New Jerusalem, the Church, into which all peoples of the world will gather. (Is 60:1-6)

> **RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Ps. 72)** "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you.

O God, with your judgment endow the king, and with your justice, the king's son; He shall govern your people with justice and your afflicted ones with judgment. Res.

Justice shall flower in his days, and profound peace, till the moon be no more. May he rule from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth. Res.

The kings of Tarshish and the Isles shall offer gifts; the kings of Arabia and Seba shall bring tribute. All kings shall pay him homage, all nations shall serve him. Res

For he shall rescue the poor when he cries out, and the afflicted when he has no one to help him. He shall have pity for the lowly and the poor; the lives of the poor he shall save. Res.

Second Reading: God invites both Jews and Gentiles to share in Christ's plan of salvation that must be preached to all peoples without exception. (Eph 3:2-3a. 5-6)

Gospel: Some Gentile rulers from the East, guided by a Star came to the Christ-Child, the Infant-King; paid Him homage and offered Him precious gifts. (Mt 2:1-12)

## **FROM** THE PASTOR'S DESK

My dear parishioners,

Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Happy New Year. We thank God for ushering us into 2022. We are nothing without Him. Let us, therefore, pray that He will guard our parish and all who come here to worship as the apple of His eye and hide us in the shade of His wings (Psalm 17:8) so that we will not fear the arrows that fly by day or the terror of the night (Psalm 91:5). I pray that we will pay more attention to our faith in this new year and grow our relationship with Jesus, the infant king, whom the magi came to adore.

Epiphany celebrates God's self-revelation as well as the revelation of Jesus to the world. In the stories of Jesus' birth, two groups visited the newborn king: the shepherds and the magi. The Church has no special feast to commemorate the shepherds' visit, but we have this special feast of Epiphany today to celebrate the visit of the magi. It is because the visit of the magi marks the manifestation of Jesus to the gentiles and the world. The magi learned of the birth of Jesus by observing a star. The star did not say anything to them. They had to interpret this natural sign of the star to know what it meant and where it led.

In the first reading, Isaiah gives the dispirited Israelites two assurances. First, God can and will intervene to restore them though they feel helpless. Second, God will use them to attract to Himself other nations. To describe God's method of accomplishing his plan, Isaiah uses the metaphor of light. The world's people are in darkness, but light will shine on the Israelites: See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you, the LORD shines, and over you appears his glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance. It is my prayer that the Lord's glory will shine on you and your household. May no darkness ever approach where you dwell and where you work.

The prophet's vision would be fulfilled centuries later. Jesus is the fullness of God's revelation and the "light shining in darkness" (In 1:5). The Magi recognized the light and gave Jesus proper respect as King of the Jews. Pope Benedict XVI notes, The Magi worshipped a simple Child in the arms of his Mother Mary because in him they recognized the source of the twofold light that had guided them: the light of the star and the light of the Scriptures. In him, they recognized the King of the Jews, the glory of Israel, but also the King of all the peoples. He also emphasizes the ecclesial implications of today's feast: The mystery of the Church and her missionary dimension are also revealed in the liturgical context of the Epiphany. She is called to make Christ's light shine in the world, reflecting it in herself as the moon reflects the light of the sun.

Like the magi, let us adore the Lord and offer Him the gift of our very lives.
