FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Parishioners,

Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you.

Once again, thank you for actively participating in the Lenten retreats we have had so far this season. Yesterday we had the Youth Lenten Retreat. I thank all parents who ensured their children took part in the retreat. This is a way of introducing our children to the riches and treasures of our Catholic faith. Not only will they develop the habit of valuing such practices, but they would also experience how such spiritual exercises nourish and refresh their souls and draw them closer to Christ Jesus, our savior.

Today's gospel reading presents the story we have been reflecting on for our Lenten retreats, namely the story of the prodigal son, also known as the story of the loving father. We have the younger son who leaves home and goes to spend his share of the father's property. Famine hits where he was after he finishes his resources on loose living. Not having anything to rely on, he remembers his father's generosity and decides to return home, willing to accept the status of an enslaved person.

There are many ways our own lives may reflect certain aspects of the younger son's life. We are told that he left for a far distant country. I suggest that "the far country" exists first in our hearts. The younger son dreamed of "enjoying" his freedom far from home and away from his father and older brother even before making the request. Thus the request was, first of all, lived in his heart and imagination. Like the younger son, the desire to journey away from God's presence begins in our hearts. That is why it is essential to pay attention to the desires that form in our hearts and how we nurture them. Depending on what the desires are, they may let us leave our Father's presence and travel far off. It is, therefore, important that the Church always calls us to examine our thoughts, and to confess the sins we commit in our thoughts.

The young man came to his senses and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. The father's love finds expression in his actions. This expression of love should propel us constantly to return home. We have a father who never deals with us according to our sin. He only deals with us according to his love and mercy. The Psalmist expresses this so well: The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love ... He does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us (Psalm 103: 8-12).

Let us return to the mercy of God during this season of Lent.
