



4TH SUNDAY FROM IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR C

First Reading: Well aware of the usual fate of a prophet, Jeremiah had no desire whatever to be a prophet. Finally, and with great reluctance, he obeyed God's call to undertake his mission. (Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Ps. 71) "I will sing of your salvation."

In you, O LORD, I take refuge; let me never be put to shame. In your justice rescue me, and deliver me; incline your ear to me, and save me. Res.

Be my rock of refuge, a stronghold to give me safety, for you are my rock and my fortress. O my God, rescue me from the hand of the wicked. Res

For you are my hope, O Lord; my trust, O God, from my youth. On you I depend from birth; from my mother's womb you are my strength. Res.

My mouth shall declare your justice, day by day your salvation. O God, you have taught me from my youth, and till the present I proclaim your wondrous deeds. Res.

Second Reading: Paul teaches that all the spiritual gifts - from the speaking of tongues to the highest form of self-giving - are worthless unless they are motivated by love. (1 Cor 12:31, 13:1-13)

Gospel: Jesus taught in the synagogue and won the approval of many for His gracious words, yet the people of His hometown, His own people rejected Him. (Luke 4:21-30)

THE PASTOR'S DESK

Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you; before you were born, I dedicated you, a prophet, to the nations.

Today's readings invite us to reflect on our Christian calling, or vocation, more generally. What does it mean to be called by God? What does God call people to do? To whom does God issue this call? Is a call an essential part of every Christian's religious life? As James Calvin Davis notes, "calling is not just reserved for those asked to do mighty things. It is the invitation to every Christian to witness to the gospel by investing with radical grace whatever worldly roles God opens to us."

In the first reading, we read about the prophet Jeremiah's call and mission: Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you; before you were born, I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you. God is emphasizing to Jeremiah that He who gave him his commission is the same person who gave him his being, and therefore He is the rightful owner and can use him in His service and for His purpose. Additionally, this verse clearly shows that it is neither our achievement nor our confidence that qualifies us to answer the call of God. Instead, it is God who prepares us to live out the vocation for which we were created. What we need to do is to avail ourselves and allow God to use us for His service.

The fact that God was entrusting Jeremiah with a mission did not mean there would be no difficulties along the way. God made the prophet aware of the posture of the people he was going to deal with and the challenges that lay ahead. We see Jesus facing opposition very early in His ministry in the gospel reading. Earlier in the reading, we are told all spoke highly of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. Not long after, they were all filled with fury. They rose up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town had been built to hurl him down headlong.

The stories of Jeremiah and Jesus indicate that we, like them, will not be spared our own trials as we live our lives in response to God's call. The good news is that God will not abandon us during moments of difficulties. Jesus passed through the midst of the crowd who wanted to hurl him down the hill and went away. God promised Jeremiah: it is I this day who have made you a fortified city, a pillar of iron, a wall of brass, against the whole land: against Judah's kings and princes, against its priests and people. They will fight against you but not prevail over you, for I am with you to deliver you, says the LORD.

As baptized Christians, no one can identify us by what we wear. Our faith is evidenced by what we do and what we say. Let us go through this week living out our Christian calling.
