# 5TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR C

First Reading: Well aware of the usual fate of a prophet, Jeremiah had no desire whatever to be a prophet. Finally, and with great reluctance, he obeyed God's call to undertake his mission. (Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19)

# THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command, I will lower the nets."

In today's gospel, Jesus preaches to a large crowd standing right at the water's edge. When the teaching had ended, Jesus, who had used Peter's boat as a pulpit, told Peter to pull out into deep water for a catch. The encounter between Jesus and Peter opens up possibilities certainly not envisaged at the time by Peter. It all begins with a risk on Jesus' part as Peter could have rejected His initiative. However, Peter was generous towards Jesus, which set into motion a happy ending.

Peter was an expert at fishing while Jesus was a carpenter. Peter could have said, "Master, we have worked hard all night long and have caught nothing, and already washed our nets." Instead, he said, "Master, we have worked hard all night long and have caught nothing, but at your command, I will lower the nets." That declaration of trust was what made the miracle that followed possible. Simon Peter understood the message very quickly. Confronted by the size of the catch, he recognized the presence of God before him and became convinced of his sinfulness. His simple confession - Leave me, Lord. I am a sinful manmarks a turning point in his life. Like Peter, when Isaiah saw the glory of God, he says, "What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips... and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of hosts." At every Mass, we come face to face with the glory of God. Like Peter and Isaiah, do we become more conscious of our sinfulness and beg for

We are told Simon Peter fell at the feet of Jesus. By falling on his knees, he gives Jesus the needed reverence. Today's world desperately needs a revival of reverence. For example, when we come into Church, we enter the presence of Jesus, who dwells in the tabernacle. We need to remember that the Church is God's house. We, therefore, need to express reverence by making a deep bow toward the tabernacle, or, if we are able to kneel, by genuflecting, before we sit. We should offer Christ the same reverence as we leave His sacramental presence.

Today's Gospel concludes with an inspiring image of commitment: When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him (Lk 5:11). Jesus requires the same reverence from us that we would follow Him without any reservation.

On Wednesday, we will begin our first parish novena for the year 2022. We will be praying the novena to the Holy Name of Jesus. The name of Iesus, as you know, means "God saves" in Hebrew. This novena extols the power of Jesus' name. Remember the story of the healing of the cripple at the beautiful gate in Acts chapter 3. Peter told him, "I have no silver and gold, but I give you what I have; in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." And he took him by the right hand and raised him up, and immediately his feet and ankles were made strong. And leaping up, he stood and walked and entered the temple with them, walking and leaping and praising God (Acts 3:6-9). It is this power that I would like us to focus on as we pray the novena. I wish you a fruitful novena.
