TUESDAY TEACHING

The 8th Commandment

YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOR.



6TH SUNDAY FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR C

First Reading: The people who put their trust in man endure precarious lives and existence. On the contrary, the life of a person who hopes and trusts in God always flourishes. (Jeremiah 17:5-8)

> **RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Ps. 1)** "Blessed are they who hope in the Lord"

Blessed the man who follows not the counsel of the wicked, nor walks in the way of sinners, nor sits in the company of the insolent, but delights in the law of the LORD and meditates on his law day and night. Res

He is like a tree planted near running water, that yields its fruit in due season, and whose leaves never fade. Whatever he does, prospers. Res.

Not so the wicked, not so; they are like chaff which the wind drives away. For the LORD watches over the way of the just, but the way of the wicked vanishes." Res.

Your right hand saves me. The LORD will complete what he has done for me; your kindness, O LORD, endures forever; forsake not the work of your hands. Res.

Second Reading: St. Paul argues against those who say that there is no resurrection of the dead. He affirms that Christ has risen from the dead and that conviction is the solid foundation upon which our Christian faith and hope rests. (Corinthians 15:12, 16-20)

Gospel: Today's Gospel reminds us of the Beatitudes taught us by Jesus in His Sermon on the Mount. Jesus commands and shows us the only way by which to live the true Christian life in this world. (Luke 6:17, 20-26)

My dear parishioners,

Blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD

Today's readings use words such as curse and happy or blessed to describe states of life. From the first reading, Jeremiah says, "Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh, whose heart turns away from the LORD...Blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD, whose hope is the LORD." In the responsorial psalm, the Psalmist also says something very similar: "Blessed the man who follows not the counsel of the wicked, nor walks in the way of sinners ...but delights in the law of the LORD ... He is like a tree planted near running water... Not so the wicked, not so; they are like chaff which the wind drives away." In the gospel reading, we are presented with another version of blessings and curses: "Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours.... woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are filled now, for you will be hungry." Presented with these two opposites and their consequences, we are expected to make the choices that will bring us happiness and joy.

The happiness that that Psalmist talks about deserves our attention. The most fundamental definition of happiness in the Psalmist's day would have been being in the presence of God. The second characteristic of happiness would be studying the Holy Scriptures. The third and crowning element to happiness is to apply what one has learned by living a life in obedience to God.

Jeremiah tells us that the only source of lasting happiness is trust in God and hope in His promises. Trust in the Lord, even when the rain does not come. Keep trusting when the odds seem to be against you. "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight" (Proverbs 3:5-6).

Take time and reflect on the beatitudes. Let me share with you what Pope Francis says about them: "The Beatitudes are like a Christian's identity card. So if anyone asks: 'What must one do to be a good Christian?', the answer is clear. We have to do, each in our own way, what Jesus told us in the Sermon on the Mount. In the Beatitudes, we find a portrait of the Master, which we are called to reflect in our daily lives."

Living the beatitudes comes with challenges. Pope Francis adds, "Although Jesus' words may strike us as poetic, they clearly run counter to the way things are usually done in our world. Even if we find Jesus' message attractive, the world pushes us towards another way of living. The Beatitudes are in no way trite or undemanding, quite the opposite. We can only practice them if the Holy Spirit fills us with his power and frees us from our weakness, our selfishness, our complacency and our pride."

Let us allow the words of Jesus to unsettle us, challenge us, and demand a real change in the way we live. The Lord bless and keep you.
