MOTHER / FATHER OF THE YEAR NOMINATION OPENED



EASTER SUNDAY

THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD, YEAR C

First Reading: Peter tells the people that he was witness to the life, death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus. He asserts that the risen Christ is Lord and Savior of all believers, as well as Judge of all the living and the dead. (Acts 10:37-43)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Ps. 118)

“This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.”

Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his mercy endures forever.

Let the house of Israel say, "His mercy endures forever." **Res**

"The right hand of the LORD has struck with power; the right hand of the LORD is exalted.

I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the LORD." **Res**

The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone.

By the LORD has this been done; it is wonderful in our eyes. **Res**

Second Reading: St. Paul exhorts Christians to celebrate Easter, the New Passover, by getting rid of the corrupting influence of evil and wickedness, but instead, they should celebrate Christ's redeeming sacrifice with a new life of sincerity and truth. (Corinthians 5:6b-8)

Gospel: When the apostles heard on Easter morning that Jesus' tomb was vacant, Peter and John hurried to confirm the story. On seeing the empty tomb, they understood what the scriptures had foretold concerning the resurrection of Christ. (John 20:1-9)

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

Christ is risen. He is risen indeed, Alleluia, Alleluia! This ancient Easter greeting summarizes the essence of our faith as Christians. The resurrection proves that Jesus is true! He told his disciples: *The Son of man will be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him; and when he is killed, after three days he will rise, and he rose!* Death could not hold our Messiah captive!

In the first reading, Peter in the house of Cornelius, summarizes the story of Jesus and makes the resurrection a key component of Jesus' life: *They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised him on the third day.* Peter also links the mission of witnessing to Jesus's resurrection: *He commissioned us to preach to the people and to testify that he is one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead.* We who celebrate Easter should be better witnesses of Jesus.

A fruitful celebration of Easter requires us to reflect on so great a mystery. Our Holy Father Pope Francis urges us, "We cannot live Easter without entering into the mystery. It is not something intellectual, something we only know or read about... It is more, much more! "To enter into the mystery" means the ability to wonder, to contemplate; the ability to listen to the silence and to hear the tiny whisper amid great silence by which God speaks to us 1 Kings 19:12). To enter into the mystery demands that we not be afraid of reality: that we not be locked into ourselves, that we not flee from what we fail to understand, that we not close our eyes to problems or deny them, that we not dismiss our questions... To enter into the mystery means going beyond our own comfort zone, beyond the laziness and indifference which hold us back, and going out in search of truth, beauty and love. It is seeking a deeper meaning, an answer, and not an easy one, to the questions which challenge our faith, our fidelity and our very existence." (Pope Francis, *Homily*, Holy Saturday, 4 April 2015)

The reflection on the mystery brings out the depth of St. Augustine's statement: *We are an Easter people. Alleluia is our song!* Let us celebrate Easter with immense gladness. Throughout Lent, we did not sing Alleluia! Today, sing Alleluia to Jesus, who lives forever. Make this Easter season special. Do not allow anyone or any event to rob you of your Easter joy!

Thank you all for making Lent memorable in our parish. As a community, we engaged in various spiritual exercises aimed at leading us to a deeper understanding of the mystery of our Lord's death and resurrection. I am proud of you for your spirit of commitment and enthusiastic participation – as was palpably manifested in the retreats and your massive turnout for the Palm Sunday procession.

I look forward to our time together for our EASTER MONDAY PICNIC.

I wish you and your families a happy Easter. *Christ is risen. He is risen indeed!*

FAITH CORNER

THE JOY OF EASTER

For Christians, Easter represents Jesus Christ's victory over death. His resurrection is proof He is the Son of God, and it is the reason we can find hope in an eternity spent with Him. At Easter, we celebrate what we believe to be the biggest moment in history.

On Good Friday, we remember how Jesus was persecuted and put to death. Jesus was crucified and took on the sins of the world, even though He was blameless. Because of this, many people wonder how this day could possibly be referred to as "good."

In order to understand the good news of the gospel, we must first understand our sinful nature and our need for a Saviour. Romans 3:23 says, "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Without Jesus, we are hopeless. Our sinful nature causes us to fall short of His glory, and the punishment we deserve is death.

But there is good news! While Jesus suffered a terrible death, it was God's plan to save us from our sins. Because Jesus conquered death, this made a way for all who believe in Him, and He reigns for eternity. If we believe in the death and resurrection of Jesus, we can receive forgiveness and salvation.

We are not meant to keep this good news to ourselves. Jesus died for the sins of the world, and the gift of salvation is available to all who believe. As Christians, we are called to tell others about God and His great love for us. Mark 16:15 says, "And he said to them, 'Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation.' " In this passage, Jesus is talking to His disciples after they had not believed Mary when she told them of His resurrection.

During this season, I encourage you to share the joy of Easter with others. Celebrate the resurrection of Jesus, and reflect on the sacrifice He made on the cross. In telling others of His goodness, we can bring Him glory.
