FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners.

No one who sets a hand to the plough and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God

Today, we are presented with stories inviting us to reflect on our Christian calling. The first reading is about the call of the prophet Elisha. One point I highlight for your reflection is what I refer to as the transfer of security and dependence, which comes with every call. Before his call, Elisha was a farmer. In other words, till his calling; farming was the source of his security. When Elijah comes and calls Elisha to become his successor, Elisha completely lets go of his former way of life. He does not just leave the farm behind. He slaughters his animals and burns his tools, a sign that he will depend on God from now on. Any lesson(s) to learn?

St Paul, in the second reading, reminds us about what we are called to: you were called for freedom, brothers and sisters. Many people construe freedom to mean different things. For some, freedom means the absence of laws or living the way one chooses. Let us note that St. Paul is referring to freedom that comes from living in accordance with the will of God, freedom that leads us to serve one another. So he cautions us: do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh; rather, serve one another through love. The emphasis on love reminds us that our fundamental mission is to make love our way of life. Paul underscores the central message of Jesus: A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this, everyone will know that you are my disciples if you love one another (John 13:34-35).

The gospel presents us with three persons who offered to follow Christ and the answers that Jesus gave to them. Let us reflect on the third person. And another said, 'I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home. To him Jesus said, 'No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God. Here Jesus uses an agricultural image to convey some profound truths about discipleship. It is said that no ploughman ever ploughed a straight furrow looking back over his shoulder. He needs to keep looking forward.

I offer two points for our reflection. Like the other two persons, the intention to follow Jesus, while a good and necessary step, is not sufficient. Though he volunteered to be a disciple, he was looking back instead of immediately looking forward to living out the demands of discipleship. There are some whose hearts are in the past. Such people are not able to give God their all. Do we have past commitments that prevent us from fully following Jesus? Second, those who begin with the work of God must resolve to go on with it. We are, therefore, encouraged to remain resolute in our resolve to follow Christ. Jesus requires unwavering commitment from us.

FAITH CORNER THE THEOLOGICAL AND **CARDINAL VIRTUES**

Dearly beloved, as we now journey in the Ordinary season, I wish that we emerse ourselves into some of the supernatural gifts of God. We shall run a series on the VIRTUES that God bestows on us. There are two types of virtues. These are: Theological virtues and Cardinal virtues.

The theological virtues are the foundation of Christian moral activity; they animate it and give it its special character. They inform and give life to all the moral virtues. They are infused by God into the souls of the faithful to make them capable of acting as his children and of meriting eternal life.

They are the pledge of the presence and action of the Holy Spirit in the faculties of the human being. They dispose Christians to live in a relationship with the Holy Trinity.

They have the One and Triune God for their origin, motive, and object. There are three theological virtues: FAITH, HOPE, and CHARITY (Love).

The cardinal virtues are human virtues, acquired by education and good actions. Cardinal comes from "cardo", the Latin word for "hinge", meaning "that on which other things depend." There are four Cardinal virtues. These are JUSTICE, PRUDENCE, FORTITUDE and TEMPERANCE.

In the coming weeks, we shall look deeply into each of these virtues and learn how to live them in our lives.
