

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her.

Hospitality is an essential Christian virtue. The first reading tells us of how Abraham and Sarah's hospitality to angels in the guise of strangers was rewarded by God, who blessed them with a son in their old age. These visitors did not come begging Abraham for a favour. It was Abraham who anticipated their needs and stepped out to serve them. He and his wife, Sarah, promptly started preparing a lavish meal to refresh their guests. Their hospitality was generously rewarded. God, speaking through the guests, promised Abraham and Sarah they would have a son! Make hospitality your way of life. Hebrews 13:2 tells us, *Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it.* In his letter to Titus, Paul emphasizes the necessity of hospitality. For one to qualify to be an elder of the Christian community, he ought to have demonstrated that he practiced hospitality (Titus 1:8).

The gospel passage about the daily comings and goings in a home picks up the hospitality theme. It also adds the importance of listening to Jesus as a necessary virtue demanded of disciples. When Jesus visits Mary and Martha, Martha sets out to attend to His needs while Mary sits at the feet of the Lord, listening to him speak. When Martha complains about Mary's actions, Jesus responds: *Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her.* Jesus cautions us about the dangers of being so distracted by our doings that we miss hearing God's Word. In other words, He prioritizes hearing God's word over preoccupation with all other concerns. By his answer, Jesus encourages Mary to continue listening to him, even though this means not helping with what in their socio-cultural milieu is regarded especially as women's work.

In many ways, our culture has adopted the norm that values productivity and busyness over reflection and listening, forgetting that reflection and listening hold the key to sustained productivity and fruitfulness. By noting that Mary had chosen the better part, Jesus reminds us that the true disciple sits at His feet and listens to Him. Sometimes the Martha in us can stand up when we become preoccupied with doing things for the Lord but relegate sitting at His feet to the background.

Fr. John Bartunek, in his book "The Better Part," notes that "The crucial sign that we may be following Martha's footsteps a little too closely is a waning life of prayer. When we skimp on our prayer life, on that precious time that we spend, as Mary did, 'at the Lord's feet listening to him speaking,' we need to stop and check our spiritual vital signs. Maybe we have let ourselves become so 'distracted with all the serving' that we have forgotten why we should be serving at all."

May what we do this week flow from the time we spend with God.

FAITH CORNER THE PRECIOUS

THE PRECIOUS BLOOD OF JESUS

The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Saviour shed for us on Calvary and reassumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified, living body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and through it washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it.

From Genesis 4:10, we meet the vengeful blood of Abel against his brother Cain after the latter had committed fratricide.

In Exodus, we meet the saving power of the blood of the one year old unblemished lamb on the Passover Night as it was smeared on the doorposts and lintels of the house of the Israelites.

In John 1:14, "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." Can there be any flesh without blood? This blood attached to the flesh of baby Jesus, Mother Church reminds us, will have its first spillage on the day baby Jesus was name and circumcised (Cf. Lk 2:21).

Luke 22:44 tells us of Jesus experience on Mount Olivet. We see the holy face of Jesus crimsoned with blood during the agony in the garden.

Then finally in John 19:34, the very precious blood of Jesus together with water will ooze forth after his side is pierced with a lance.

It is this PRECIOUS BLOOD that wrought our salvation. It is at the cost of this PRECIOUS BLOOD that you and I have been bought.

As a Church, we prepare ourselves for the devotion of the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. Devotion to the Precious Blood is not a spiritual option, it is a spiritual obligation, and that not only for priests, but for every follower of Christ.

Devotion includes veneration, invocation and imitation. We are to venerate by adoring and showing deep gratitude to Jesus who shed his blood for us. We are to invoke upon the power contained in the Blood of Jesus in solving our problems and we are to imitate the character of Jesus who is humble to the point of sacrificing himself. Let us ready ourselves for this powerful devotion from Saturday 23rd July to Sunday 31st July, 2022. May the Blood of Jesus make all the impossible situations of your life possible. Amen
