Gospel: Jesus teaches us how to pray and gives us power to address God as our 'Father'. In addition, Jesus teaches us to always persevere in prayer to God. **(Luke 11:1-13)**

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come...

The gospel today presents us with Luke's version of the Lord's Prayer. I focus my reflection on the petition: THY KINGDOM COME. What do we mean when we pray: thy kingdom come. The Catholic tradition has always taught that Jesus is king of the whole world. When we celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King we affirm that "His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed" (Daniel 7:14). Through the mystery of the incarnation, the Kingdom of God is present in our midst. However, there is also a future dimension to God's Kingdom. In praying *Thy kingdom come*, we celebrate God's presence while waiting for the kingdom of God to come in its fullness.

In his reflection on this petition, Pope Francis mentions that "The kingdom of God is something that belongs to us, or rather, it is better to think of it another way: we must allow ourselves to be possessed by the certainty that it has come. This is true Christian faith. But at the same time, there is also the need to cast the anchor there and to hold on to the cord because the Kingdom is still coming."

The kingdom of God was an essential part of the mission of Jesus. In Mark's gospel, the very first words that Jesus spoke were: "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent and believe in the good news" (Mark 1:15). Jesus used the parable of the sower, the parable of the weeds, the parable of the mustard seed, the parable of the yeast, the parable of buried treasure, the parable of the merchant in search of fine pearls and the parable of net thrown into the sea to explain what the Kingdom of God is like. All these parables point to the following fundamental truths about the kingdom of God: God's kingdom is of inestimable value; the kingdom's presence is manifested in those who do God's will, and it represents the victory of God over evil and the forces of darkness.

Jesus expects us to live as members of God's kingdom. He reminds us: "strive first for the kingdom of God and His righteousness..." (Mt 6:33). We strive for the kingdom of God by praying that we should be so possessed by God that our thoughts and our actions will bear testimony to Him. Pope Benedict XVI emphasizes that, "to pray for the Kingdom of God is to say to Jesus: let us be yours, Lord! Pervade us, live in us; gather scattered humanity in your body, so that in you everything may be subordinated to God and you can then hand over the universe to the Father, in order that 'God may be all in all.'"

When we pray *Thy Kingdom Come*, we are praying that God's reign should be firmly established in our hearts and over all the earth. We pray God should overcome evil. We also ask that we will live like children of the kingdom so that through us God's Kingdom will be established on earth.

FAITH CORNER

FRATELLI TUTTI: GETTING FAMILIAR WITH THE HOLY FATHER'S IDEA OF UNIVERSAL BROTHERHOOD AND SOCIAL FRIENDSHIP

I bring you the summary of the first talk: "Fratelli Tutti: Getting Familiar with the Holy Father's Idea of Universal Brotherhood and Social Friendship" by Rev. Fr. Ebenezer Akesseh. Fratelli tutti is a papal encyclical written by Pope Francis in 2022. Pope Francis embarked on a journey to draw the minds of humanity to social friendship. The Holy Father begins his encyclical by identifying some of the problems threatening the bonds of friendship in the world. He points out: the effects of the conflicts and wars on the present time; unfair economic systems; cultural colonization; unhealthy political life; globalization; racism; ethnicity and abuse of universal human rights as problems of our time.

Pope Francis after elucidating on these problems and how the COVID-19 pandemic shook the world, gives us hope that there is light at the end of the tunnel. COVID-19 era has taught us that our lives are inter-woven. For Pope Francis, health workers were ready to lay down their lives for the care and safety for COVID-19 patients, and this gives hope to humanity and this HOPE is BOLD. Taking the Parable of the Good Samaritan, he highlights on the relevance of this parable on Friendship and Universal Brotherhood. For him, humanity must all act like the Good Samaritan. We must not be the unconcerned passerby at an accident scene. We must not be the hit and run driver. He asks, how do we include those abandoned by the wayside into our moral compass?

We may have only one chance to save a life. We must not help because the individual is in our social group. He admonishes us not to reduce our life relationships with a small group because in life we cannot know ourselves apart from a broader network of relationships and these relationships include those we do not know and those who have preceded us but more importantly our readiness to embrace them regardless of their differences.

Pope Francis seeks to help us reflect how we foster openness to others. Love is just more than a series of benevolent actions. Our love for others, for who they are, moves us to see what is best for the life of the other person. Our love must be without boundaries.

It must be opened to everyone. Everything we do must be motivated by love and this love must be inspired by the story of the Good Samaritan. We are all called to Universal Brotherhood and Social Friendship and this call must be expressed in concrete actions of love.
