

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners.

His mercy endures forever

Thank you so much for making Easter wonderful for our parish. The solemnity of the triduum, the beauty of Easter Sunday and the joy of Easter Monday was very fulfilling and uplifting. I commend the Day Born Groups for embracing the idea of using the Day Borns as a means for building a strong community. I look forward to many joyous and spiritually rewarding celebrations together.

On Good Friday, we begun the Divine Mercy novena in preparation for today's feast. Together with the Catholic World, we prayed God's mercy not only for ourselves but also for the whole world. Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. This feast was instituted by Pope John Paul II at the Mass for the canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska in the year 2000.

In his encyclical "Dives in Misericordia" (Rich in Mercy) published on the 30th of November, 1980, Pope John Paul II reflects on the mercy of God. He notes, "in Christ and through Christ, God also becomes especially visible in His mercy; that is to say, there is emphasized that attribute of the divinity which the Old Testament, using various concepts and terms, already defined as 'mercy.' Christ confers on the whole of the Old Testament tradition about God's mercy a definitive meaning. Not only does He speak of it and explain it by the use of comparisons and parables, but above all He Himself makes it incarnate and personifies it. He Himself, in a certain sense, is mercy. To the person who sees it in Him - and finds it in Him -God becomes 'visible' in a particular way as the Father who is rich in mercy."

The responsorial psalm of today celebrates the mercy of God: "His mercy endures forever." What is evident in the psalm is that all the benefactions and the safety the Psalmist enjoys from God is as a result of God's mercy. He says: "I was hard pressed and was falling, but the LORD helped me. My strength and my courage is the LORD, and he has been my savior." If the psalmist celebrates the mercy of God this way, then let us continue to pray the Divine Mercy chaplet. We stand to benefit from the mercy of God reflected in Jesus Christ.

As we celebrate the mercy of God, let us also remember the Divine injunction: "Be merciful as your heavenly father is merciful" (Luke 6:36). We cannot embrace the mercy of God if we are unwilling to be dispensers of mercy. Being merciful implies not treating others according to their conduct. It requires not paying back injuries. It requires letting go of past hurts. If requires setting free those we are holding in bondage.

We can be instruments of mercy when we practice the corporal works of mercy: These are: feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, clothing the naked, sheltering the homeless, visiting the sick, visiting those in prison and burying the dead.

As you live the power of the resurrection, radiate the mercy of God this week.
