FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners.

My sheep hear my voice; I know them and they follow me.

We celebrate all mothers, both living and dead, and all women who have mothered so many people. We thank God for your lives, sacrifices, faith, and never-give-up spirit that have continuously been a source of strength and support for many people. I pray that God blesses you all with good health and many favours for all you do for humanity. I offer Theodore Roosevelt's advice to mothers for your reflection: "Into the woman's keeping is committed the destiny of the generations to come after us. In bringing up your children, you mothers must remember that while it is essential to love and be tender, it is no less essential to be wise and firm.

Besides training your sons and daughters in the softer and milder virtues, you must seek to give them those stern and hardy qualities which in after life they will surely need. Teach boys and girls alike that they are not to look forward to lives spent in avoiding difficulties but to lives spent in overcoming difficulties. Teach them that work, for themselves and also for others, is not a curse but a blessing; seek to make them happy, to make them enjoy life, but seek also to make them face life with the steadfast resolution to wrest success from labour and adversity, and to do their whole duty before God and to man. Surely she who can thus train her sons and her daughters is thrice fortunate among women."

Every fourth Sunday of Easter is known as World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Let us pray that God "will touch the hearts of the faithful and enable each of them to discover with gratitude God's call in their lives, to find the courage to say 'yes' to God, to overcome all weariness through faith in Christ, and to make of their lives a song of praise for God, for their brothers and sisters, and for the whole world" (Pope Francis, Vocations' Sunday, 2020).

The Gospel talks about Jesus as the Good Shepherd. In the Eastern world, the relationship between the shepherd and his flock was intimate and personal. In the four verses of today's Gospel, Jesus uses the image to talk about the close relationship between Himself and us. He says, my sheep hear my voice; I know them and they follow me. Shepherds were so familiar with their sheep that when the shepherds came into the fold, each made a distinct guttural sound and only his sheep would recognize and follow. That is what Jesus meant when he said, my sheep hear my voice.

As followers of Christ, can we sincerely say that we consistently and faithfully hear and follow Jesus, the Good Shepherd? Do you have an intimate relationship with Jesus? Sometimes we are distracted from following our Shepherd. We allow the lures and the attractions of this world to drown the voice of our master. Let us pray for the grace to be faithful followers of the risen Lord.

Keep praying the Holy Rosary.
