



# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

I give you a new commandment: love one another.

Before Jesus would depart from this world, He gave his disciples a new commandment: love one another. The injunction to love had been mandated in the Old Testament. For example, in Leviticus 19:18, God says Do not take revenge on anyone or continue to hate him, but love your neighbour as you love yourself. What then is different in the new commandment? This new commandment is founded on the personality and example of Jesus.

In his reflection on John 13, John Yieh, a scripture scholar, says: "the commandment to love one another sets a high standard. Disciples are required to love one another the same way Jesus loves them. Following Jesus in ministry, they have witnessed how Jesus loves all who come to him, in spite of their social standing and gender difference and in spite of his own hunger, fatigue, or risk of life. Jesus has called them, fed them, taught them, and prayed for them. Earlier in the night, Jesus had even washed their feet. Now they are commanded to imitate Jesus and do the same to one another. To love Jesus is to love fellow believers, and vice versa."

This new commandment reminds us that what sets us apart as disciples of Christ is our practical demonstration of love - our acts of sacrifice, charity, and service to God and one another. This is what Jesus means when He says in the last verse of today's Gospel: This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.

To love is to know God - Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love (1 John 4:7-8). John devotes his letters to talking about the essence of Christian love. For example, in 1 John 4:20, he says: If anyone says, I love God, and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen. It is said that when John became old, he was carried to churches and assemblies. Wherever he went, he repeated the words, "Little children, love one another." His disciples, wearied by the constant repetition, asked him why he always said this. "Because," he replied, "it is the Lord's commandment, and if it only be fulfilled, it is enough."

The command to love has communal implications. Do we show sincere love in our community? Is our love based on mere smiles or genuine love? If somebody had to choose between two churches, would they opt for our church on the evidence of our love and community spirit? In other words, can anyone standing by, say of us, see how they love one another? This community is all we have. We can constantly make it better through our practical deeds of godly love. Let us demonstrate authentic witness to the resurrected Lord by showing genuine love for one

I encourage you to pray the Holy Rosary.

# FAITH CORNER FIGHTING DISTRACTIONS WHEN PRAYING THE ROSARY

Praying the rosary can be challenging. The repetition of prayers may provide familiar comfort but also can lead to rote recital. Rather than focusing on the prayers and meditating on the mysteries, your mind may wander off to unfinished tasks, problems at work, family tensions, or weekend plans. You might even lose count of the Hail Marys or finish feeling unfulfilled.

Distractions inevitably arise, and even saints have had to deal with them. So here are a few tried and tested tips to keep you focused and on track:

- 1. Before you begin, prepare. Never address your words to God while you are thinking of something else. Before you begin the rosary, know the mysteries that you have to deal with and immerse yourself into it.
- 2. Set the right environment. You can pray anytime and anywhere. The rosary is a meditative prayer, and meditation does not go well with multitasking. So take preventive measures to ward off distractions. Turn off the TV, put away the phone, and choose a quiet place, if possible. God deserves your undivided attention.
- 3. Pray with all your senses. You can more easily focus your mind and heart on prayer if you engage your senses as much as possible. Focus intently on the prayers as they are recited. If going solo, pray aloud or pray along with a recording of the rosary. Keep religious images or a crucifix within sight to keep your eyes from wandering. And use the beads! They give you a way of praying even through the sense of touch.
- 4. Decide what to meditate upon. Should you meditate on each mystery, on your prayer intentions, or the words of the prayers themselves? Each of these options is valid. Choose one, or slide gracefully among all three, as long as you maintain a spirit of prayer (take note of the next two points).
