


VISIT TO NSAWAM FEMALE PRISONS

10TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR C

First Reading: The day of Pentecost came with the spectacular outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the apostles. They were suddenly empowered to proclaim the Gospel of the risen Christ the Lord to the amazement of the crowds gathered in Jerusalem for the festival. (Acts 2:1-11).

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Ps. 8)

"O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth!."

When I behold your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars which you set in place — What is man that you should be mindful of him, or the son of man that you should care for him? Res.

You have made him little less than the angels, and crowned him with glory and honor. You have given him rule over the works of your hands, putting all things under his feet: Res.

All sheep and oxen, yes, and the beasts of the field, The birds of the air, the fishes of the sea, and whatever swims the paths of the seas. Res.

Second Reading: The freedom that we have obtained in Christ places us in a filial relationship with God. It enables us to call God Father (Abba), as Jesus did and makes us joint heirs of eternal life with Christ. (Romans 8:8-17)

Gospel: Jesus promises to send the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Truth, from the Father to teach and remind the Church of everything that He has taught them. Jesus also promises that He himself, with the Father, will come to dwell with those who love Him and keep His commandments.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him.

Very soon, the Easter season will be over. Till then, let the Alleluia continue to impress on our hearts the message of the resurrection of Jesus. The gospel begins with: Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him. These words convey the motivation for keeping the words of Jesus and the consequence of adhering to Jesus' message. Jesus emphasizes that our eagerness and willingness to do what He asks of us should be based on our love for Him. In other words, we will keep His words if - and only if - we love Him. Examine your heart and see if you consciously make a connection between your love for Jesus and obedience to his

Some tend to think that Jesus demands too much from us when His words challenge us to come out of our comfort zones or when they ask us to do what we find to be counterintuitive. For instance, why do I have to love my enemies and pray for those who persecute me? Others feel that Jesus takes away the freedom to do what one likes. What about being choosy? Some tend to engage in what is referred to as scriptural smorgasbord. They pick and choose what suits them. They take that part of God's word that they are comfortable with or which they find easy to obey and leave out those parts that challenge them to live above reproach.

Think about these words of Jesus: whoever does not love me does not keep my words. We could oscillate between the two camps: loving God and not loving Him. I know we love Jesus. I know we strive to please Him. Let us, therefore, demonstrate our love for him by striving to keep His words. We stand to benefit by developing the virtue of obedience to God's word. Jesus says that God will love us. In other words, our way to the Father's heart is through obedience to the Son.

The Gospel also talks about the Holy Spirit. The term used to refer to the Holy Spirit is Advocate. It is worth noting that the Advocate will first and foremost advocate for Jesus. As Jesus notes, the Spirit "will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have said to you" (v. 26). Thus, one of the functions of the Holy Spirit is to enable us to recollect the words of Jesus. Since Jesus says our love for him is tied to our obedience to His words, let us always pray that we will be docile to the promptings of the Holy Spirit as the Spirit reminds us of the words of Jesus.

On Friday, we begin the Pentecost Novena, during which we shall prepare ourselves for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost day. I encourage you to take an active part in the novena. Focus your attention on the Holy Spirit and pray that He will continue to warm your hearts to Jesus' words.

LIVING WITH THE SPIRIT

The promise of Jesus to send us a Helper has been fulfilled again as today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday. Jesus clothed his disciples with the Holy Spirit in the upper room and has clothed us too in the church. Now that the Spirit has been gifted to us, we must learn how to activate and live with Him. Below are some of the ways.

- 1. Pray for God to immerse us in the Holy Spirit if we are yet to be baptized in the Holy Spirit.
- 2. Pray for grace to daily spend time with God and walk in the Spirit so the Holy Spirit can fill us more and more.
- 3. Allow Christ and not the flesh to live and work through us. God must have full control over every area of our lives, every decision we make, every step we take.
- 4. Get to know the Spirit through the reading of the Scriptures. God's Word of life must not depart from our mouths; keep feeding on it; meditating on it and speaking the Word.
- 5. Witness in the Holy Spirit. When we are not ashamed of the gospel and can boldly and publicly declare the gospel, we will be filled with the power of God (Rom 1:16)
- 6. We must exercise our authority in the Spirit. Spiritual authority releases God's power (Eph 1:17-19). We must know ourselves; know the power embedded in us through Christ Jesus and put that power to work so we can exercise our spiritual dominion over situations of life and over forces of darkness.

Beloved, the Holy Spirit has been given to us. How we use Him is left to us. May we fan into flame this beautiful and powerful gift of Jesus in our lives.
