 Thank you for the laity week talks. I was at the last Tuesday talk on the topic "Fratelli Tutti and the Practice of Dialogue in Ghana", given by Mr. Kofi Mensah.

I found the approaches given by the speaker for enhancing dialogue very instructive and worth practicing. As the speaker indicated, dialogue fosters peace and harmony instead of the violence and acrimony we see in our homes and in the public.

In my advanced age, I still find the approaches to enhancing dialogue useful to integrate into my daily life. I noted the following approaches according to what the speaker outlined yesterday to enhance dialogue:

- Approach one another
- Speak to each other
- Listen to each other
- Look out for consensus or win-win situation

To achieve this, we have to:

- ↳ Respect one another and each other's views
- ↳ Be open and not underrate anyone
- ↳ Appreciate people's views and seek to understand their standpoint
- ↳ Allowing people to speak out

I particularly like the last point about allowing people to speak out. I keep telling the young officers I manage to never fear to speak out, for wisdom does not reside in only one particular mind.

It is on this note that I propose that the church should take the issue of dialogue seriously and inculcate the principles and practices in the young ones. We can introduce this at our Sunday schools, and at the Primary and JSS levels.

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

*When a man has had a great deal given him,  
a great deal will be demanded of him;  
when a man has had a great deal given  
him on trust, even more will be expected of him.*

These words tell us of Jesus' expectations of his disciples. This statement holds for every organization. Listen to any morning show on radio or TV for just 30 minutes, and you will notice the spotlight of accountability on public officials. This statement from Jesus in today's Gospel was in response to a question put to Him by Peter. Jesus had said that His followers should be ready at all times with their lamps lit to welcome the master. Peter wanted to know whether the message was for them.

The apostles had been given much. Not only were they privileged to be the companions of Jesus, but also Jesus would later make them the custodians of the good news of salvation. So Jesus admonished them to be aware of the grave responsibilities to be entrusted to them. It is easy to assume that Jesus' warning was meant for some people. However, if we fully understand the import of being Christian, each of us needs to gird up our loins. Who has not been given a great deal? The father has responsibility over his family; likewise, the mother or the guardian; the President; Members of Parliament, the chief executive; the teacher, the worker, indeed everyone. We need to understand that each human life is a task, a mission to know, love, and serve God in a particular way. Therefore, we need to use the gifts we have received, such as our lives, talents, and education, to accomplish what our master wants from us.

It could be attractive for us to rest on our oars and dally with the need to paddle to the end, thinking, there is time: *my master is taking his time in coming*. Instead of doing that, let us be faithful and wise; let us gird our loins and keep our lamps burning; so that when the day of reckoning comes, the Lord, our Master, will find us ready and worthy – to the greater glory of His name.

Thank you for participating fully and actively in the novena to the Precious Blood of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. May the drops of that rich fountain continually unite us closely to the love of God and deliver us from all harm. As with all the other novenas, you can pray the novena to the Precious Blood anytime to help you grow spiritually. Yesterday we began another novena in preparation for the feast of the Assumption of our Blessed Mother Mary. I encourage you to pray this novena as we ask Mary, our mother, to intercede for all of us as we bring our prayers of praise and adoration and our petitions and tears to God.

I am looking forward to seeing many of you coming at different times to pray the Rosary of a thousand hail Marys on Assumption day. It will begin at midday and conclude at 6:30 with evening Mass.

## FRATELLI TUTTI AND THE QUEST FOR PEACE AND RECONCILIATION IN GHANA

Ghana is a relatively peaceful country though she has witnessed a lot of military take overs. Ghana being a multi-ethnic, multi-lingual, multi-cultural and multi-religious nation has put in a lot of effort to maintain peace in the life of Ghanaians.

The setting up of the National Reconciliation Commission and the National Peace Council are moves to heal the wounds from the abuse of human rights in the past and also face squarely any occurrence in the present that may threaten the peace we are all enjoying. In Fratelli tutti, Pope Francis spells out the roles that individuals, nations and religions must play to establish the peace that Jesus the Prince of Peace promised us. "Peace" from the Hebrew shalom indicates the absence of conflict and war. It also means making things good and also restoring something which is lost or stolen. Peace is an art that involves and regards everyone who is ready to play his or her part in restoring order in society.

Without mincing words, the Holy Father condemns wars because they destroy the very beauty of creation most especially human life. He frowns on the few people who profit from the sufferings of the masses during wars.

The many people who are injured not only physically but spiritually and emotionally must be helped to heal. It is on this point that the Holy Father calls on world religions to serve as guides in this healing process. Religious leaders must echo loudly now more than ever, their message of peace and not vengeance. Political leaders must not become witch hunters with the aim of scoring political points which will only end up disrupting the developmental process of the nation. All of us must work for peace.
