FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished!

Today Jesus talks to us about the nature of His mission: I have come to bring fire to the earth and how I wish it were blazing already. Jesus refers to the purifying nature of His presence and the consequence of this presence. In Jewish thought, fire is almost always the symbol of judgment. So, then, Jesus regarded the coming of his kingdom as a time of judgment. Also, one of the imageries for the Word of God is FIRE (Jeremiah 20:9). Fire refines and transforms. Thus, using the illustration of fire, Jesus points out to us that He, who in the beginning was the Word and was with God, has come to sow the seed of His word here on earth, and His greatest desire is to see His word take seed in us.

Jesus says, "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." One might wonder, "I thought Jesus came to bestow his peace on us all; why does he say this?" The Jews believed that there would be world peace when the Messiah came. However, this message of Jesus seems to contradict the very message of the prince of peace. The point in this saying is that the very nature of Jesus' kingdom obliges us to make a categorical choice - there is no sitting on the fence. Thus, the division Jesus talks about results from the choices that people will have to make. By using the family as a metaphor for that division, Jesus was not encouraging the breakdown of filial bonds. He was emphasizing that His call demands an unconditional response. Since some will accept Him and others will reject Him, conflict will inevitably arise. As His followers make their decisions, their different values, morals, goals, and purposes will set them

Thank you for praying the novena to our Lady of Assumption. Tomorrow is the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven. We thank God for choosing the Blessed Virgin Mary and honouring her as our mother and queen. On the 1st of November 1950, Pope Pius XII officially declared the Assumption as a dogma of Catholic faith in the encyclical, Munificentimus Deus: "We believe that when her earthly life was finished, Mary was taken up, body and soul, into heavenly glory, where the Lord exalted her as Queen of Heaven" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, # 966). Mary's assumption is an act of God. Mary's Assumption gives us the assurance and hope of our resurrection. It is a sign to us that after our earthly life, through God's grace and our good life, we, too, will join the Blessed Mother in giving glory to God. May our Queen and Mother intercede for us now and at the hour of our death.

I encourage you to be part of the Rosary of Thousand Hail Marys tomorrow from 1 pm to 6:30 pm. Come at any time and leave when you have to. We are doing this together as a community.

CHURCH'S PREFERENTIAL OPTION FOR THE POOR

The outbreak of COVID-19 caused Pope Francis to shift his focus from inter-religious dialogue to issues concerning universal brotherhood and social friendship in the face of the problems that emerged from this pandemic.
